Diane Ley is the Deputy Director of the County of Hawaii Department of Research and Development. She was appointed to this position by Mayor Harry Kim because of her extensive background in the Big Island's diverse communities. Her role at the Department of Research and Development includes a wide range of administrative tasks to assist with implementation of the department's functions including supporting agriculture, tourism, energy and business development.

Diane previously served as the Deputy to the Chairperson of the Hawaii Department of Agriculture and operated a vegetable farm in Volcano. As an administrative assistant with the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation for eleven years, she worked extensively with farmers and ranchers across the state. She serves on the board of the Agricultural Leadership Foundation of Hawaii and as vice-chair of the Hawaii Rural Development Council. Diane also has a strong grasp of the legislative process at the county, state and federal levels. She served as the Board of Agriculture's legislative coordinator and as a legislative assistant to the Hawaii County Council.
